The San Jose Sharks enter the **2024 NHL Draft** with **10 selections**, starting with the first overall pick for the first time in franchise history. Last season the Sharks picked twice in the first round, taking C **Will Smith** (fourth overall) and F **Quentin Musty** (26th overall).

San Jose has previously made six picks within the top four in franchise history, including three second-overall picks and twice selecting a player third overall. Players the Sharks have acquired in the top four include Smith, **Brad Stuart** (third in 1998), **Patrick Marleau** (second in 1997), **Andrei Zyuzin** (second in 1996), **Mike Rathje** (third in 1992) and **Pat Falloon** (second in 1991).

## 2023 SHARKS DRAFT RECAP

The Sharks made nine picks in the 2023 NHL Draft and the crop of new additions to the organization saw several players post strong seasons, headlined by first-rounders center **Will Smith** and forward **Quentin Musty**, as well as forward **Kasper Halttunen** (second round, 36th overall) and defenseman **Luca Cagnoni** (fourth round, 123rd overall).

Smith enjoyed a historic freshman season at Boston College, helping lead the Eagles to the National Championship Game behind 71 points, tied with Jack Eichel (Boston University, 2014-15) for the most by a NCAA U-19 skater since the 1993-94 season. The Lexington, Massachusetts native was named 2023 Sharks Prospect of the Year presented by Kaiser Permanente after being named Hockey East Tournament MVP and earning spots on the Frozen Four All-Tournament Team, AHCA East All-America First Team, Hockey East First All-Star Team and Hockey East All-Rookie Team. He was also one of 10 finalists for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given annually to the top player in college hockey. In international play, Smith won a Gold Medal with Team USA at the World Junior Championship, finishing the tournament with nine points (four goals, five assists) in seven games.

Musty provided consistently strong offensive play to Sudbury of the OHL, finishing as one of five skaters to reach the 100-point threshold on the year (102; T-4th). Musty finished fifth in the league in goals (43) and was eighth with 59 assists, leading the league with a 1.92 points-per-game scoring clip. His point total was second among the league's U-19 skaters.

**2023 SHARKS DRAFT RECAP CONTINUED**

Halttunen helped the London Knights win the OHL crown, pacing league skaters with 17 goals in 18 postseason contests, finishing the playoffs with 26 points. He tallied 11 points (eight goals, three assists) in a four-game sweep in the championship series, including back-to-back hat tricks in games two and three, the first player in OHL history to record consecutive hat tricks in the final playoff round. Halttunen tallied 10 points over the final three contests of the decisive series. In the regular season, the Finnish forward tallied 61 points (32 goals, 29 assists) in 57 games. In Memorial Cup competition, Halttunen registered four goals and tallied five points in four games, helping the Knights finish as tournament runner-up. He earned a spot on the tournament All-Star team.

Cagnoni helped Portland earn the WHL's U.S. Division crown with strong two-way play, finishing with 90 points (18 goals, 72 assists) in 65 regular season games. His scoring total was the most by a league defenseman since 1994-95 and helped earn him a spot on the division's First All-Star Team. He went on to click at a point-per-game pace in the postseason, finishing with 13 points (three goals, 10 assists) in 13 games as the Winterhawks finished as league runner-up.

## 2024 DRAFT NOTES

'YOU ALWAYS REMEMBER YOUR FIRST'

Since the Sharks inception in 1991 into the NHL, the organization has the opportunity to select a player first overall for the first time in franchise history. This is the 34th NHL Draft the Sharks have been a part of, and will become the 19th different team to select first overall since then. Eleven teams have selected first multiple times, with Edmonton (4), Ottawa (3), and Tampa Bay (3) who have held the most. The Sharks are just the second Pacific Division team to hold the first overall choice (Edmonton) since the 1991 draft.

Among the players selected first overall from 1991-2014, only two players have not appeared in more than 10 NHL Seasons, with 11 players still active in the NHL, with the longest tenured player being Marc-Andre Fleury. In this span, players selected with the first overall choice have appeared in, on average, 14 and a half NHL campaigns, with seven of these players winning at least one Stanley Cup Final with their original franchise (**Vincent Lecavalier & Steven Stamkos**, TBL; **Marc-Andre Fleury** and **Sidney Crosby**, PIT; **Alex Ovechkin**, WSH; **Patrick Kane**, CHI; **Nathan MacKinnon**, COL). There are still four players currently in the 2024 Stanley Cup Playoffs who can win a Stanley Cup with their original franchise (**Ryan Nugent-Hopkins & Connor McDavid**, EDM; **Aaron Ekblad**, FLA; **Alexis Lafreniere**, NYR)

Since 1991, typically teams who have held the first overall selection have primarily chosen a centerman, with 16 players listed as a center chosen with the pick, followed by eight defensemen, seven wingers/forwards, and two goaltenders. The OHL has seen 12 different players chosen since 1991, by far the most among any league or professional program. QMJHL has had seven players chosen, followed by the WHL with three, and the USA program, Russian leagues, and the NCAA have seen two players each selected.

**2024 DRAFT NOTES**  
**FINDING FLASH AT 14**

The Sharks enter the 2024 NHL Draft with a chance to make their second-ever selection at 14th overall, previously picking defenseman **Jeff Jillson** in that slot in the 1999 draft. Jillson played in parts of two seasons with the Sharks - 2001-02 and 2002-03 - finishing his tenure in teal with five goals and 19 assists in 74 games before going on to compete for the Boston Bruins (2003-04) and Buffalo Sabres (2003-04 and 2004-05).

Impact players can be found at 14, with selections dating back to the Sharks' inception highlighted by back-to-back Boston picks forward **Jake DeBrusk** (2015) and defenseman **Charlie McAvoy** (2016), St. Louis tabbing center **Jaden Schwartz** (2010), the Avalanche adding defenseman **Kevin Shattenkirk** (2007), Edmonton getting **Devan Dubnyk** (2004), Chicago selecting defenseman **Brent Seabrook** (2003) and Washington's 1992 pick of defenseman **Sergei Gonchar**.

Among the players picked 14th since 1991, seven went on to win the Stanley Cup, four with the organization that drafted them, a list that includes Cal Foote (TBL), Schwartz (STL), Seabrook (CHI) and Adam Deadmarsh (won with COL after being drafted by Quebec). Four of the players participated in NHL All-Star Games, including Dubnyk (2015-16, 16-17, 18-19), Seabrook (2014-15), Shattenkirk (2014-15) and **Zemgus Girgensons** (2014-15). Four earned spots on end-of-season NHL All-Star teams, including McAvoy (Second Team, 2021-22), Dubnyk (Second Team, 2014-15), Gonchar (Second Team, 2001-02) and Michael Grabner (2010-11 All-Rookie Team). Dubnyk (Masterton Trophy, 2014-15) and Ethan Moreau (King Clancy Trophy, 2008-09) won league end-of season awards.

**2024 DRAFT NOTES**  
**BRICK BY BRICK**

In just two years at the helm of the organization, Mike Grier has overseen an overhaul of the team's prospect pipeline that has lifted the club from 27th in the NHL to fourth according to *The Athletic* Prospect Pipeline rankings. San Jose has welcomed developing players through trades, drafting and free-agent signings, reshaping the future of the franchise one skater at a time.

From the 2022 draft class, **Filip Bystedt** (27th overall) made his North American debut at the end of the 2023-24 campaign, joining the San Jose Barracuda (AHL) following his SHL season. He skated in eight AHL games, recording seven points (four goals, three assists). He won a Silver Medal alongside fellow Sharks prospect **Mattias Hävelid** (45th overall) at the 2024 World Junior Championship, helping host Sweden reach the Gold Medal Game. Bystedt ranked seventh among SHL skaters in scoring in the 2023-24 campaign, finishing with 17 points (eight goals, nine assists) in 47 games. Hävelid finished 10th among the age group in scoring with 12 points in 43 games, second among SHL U-20 defensemen on the offensive end. Forward **Cameron Lund** (34th overall) helped Northeastern capture its second consecutive Beanpot win and finished fifth on his team with 30 points (11 goals, 19 assists) in 35 games. In the fifth round, the Sharks selected defenseman **Jake Furlong** in the fifth round (140th overall), the blueliner captaining Halifax and posting 30 points (three goals, 27 assists) in 56 games with the Mooseheads and represented Canada at the World Junior Championship.

From the 2023 class, San Jose saw strong seasons in 2023-24 from first round picks **Will Smith** (fourth overall) and **Quentin Musty** (26th overall) as well as **Kasper Halttunen** (36th overall) and **Luca Cagnoni** (123rd overall). Smith, who inked his entry-level deal with San Jose on May 28, led the NCAA in scoring (71 points) and assists (46) and earned AHCA East First Team All-America, Frozen Four All-Tournament Team, Hockey East Tournament MVP, Hockey East First All-Star Team and Hockey East All-Rookie Team honors. Internationally, he and defenseman **Eric Pohlkamp** (132nd overall) won Gold at the World Junior Championship, Smith totaling nine points (five goals, four assists) in seven games with a pair of helpers in the Gold Medal Game against host Sweden. Musty was one of only five OHL skaters to reach the 100-point mark on the year, leading the league with a 1.92 points-per-game scoring clip and finishing the year with 102 points (43 goals, 59 assists). Halttunen, a second-round selection, enjoyed a strong season with the London Knights, posting 61 points (32 goals, 29 assists) in 57 regular season games. He went on to lead the OHL playoffs with 18 goals, including back-to-back hat tricks in the championship series, as the Knights won the league crown and went on to finish runner-up at the Memorial Cup, a four-game sprint in which Halttunen had five points and four goals to earn a spot on the tournament's All-Star Team. Fourth-round selection Cagnoni led WHL defensemen with 90 points, the first league rearguard to reach the 90-point threshold since the 1993-94 campaign.

In trades, Grier added former Vegas Golden Knights first-round selection **David Edstrom** in a trade deadline deal, March 8, 2024. The 19-year-old center finishing tied for fourth among league U-20 skaters with 19 points (seven goals, 12 assists) in 44 games with Frölunda HC. Also added to the Sharks' pipeline was defenseman **Jack Thompson**, the former Tampa Bay third-round pick totaling 41 points (six goals, 35 assists) in 62 AHL games and appearing in three NHL contests in 2023-24. Fellow defenseman **Shakir Mukhamadullin**, acquired in 2022-23, tallied 34 points (seven goals, 27 assists) in 55 games in his first full AHL season, representing the Barracuda at the AHL All-Star Classic and making his NHL debut on Jan. 27 with the Sharks vs. Buffalo. He added his first NHL point, an assist, on Jan. 31 at Anaheim. Defenseman **Henry Thrun** was acquired from Anaheim on Feb. 28, 2023, and has gone on to play in 59 games with the Sharks, registering 13 points (three goals, 10 assists).

Also acquired via trades were the 14th-overall pick, New Jersey's and Tampa Bay's (via Detroit) second-round position, Tampa Bay's third-round selection, Vegas's fourth-round slot and Pittsburgh's fifth-round turn in the 2024 NHL Draft as well as Vegas's first-round pick in 2025.

As a free-agent signing, the Sharks inked forward **Collin Graf** out of Quinnipiac on April 4, 2024, a player who concluded his collegiate career with 49 points (22 goals, 27 assists) in 34 games with the Bobcats in 2023-24 and was a finalist for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award.

**2024 DRAFT NOTES**  
**TAKES TOWARD THE TOP**

San Jose enters the 2024 NHL Draft with two picks in the top 14, including the first overall pick for the first time in franchise history. It's just the second time in team history that the Sharks have had two picks inside the top 14, the first being in 1992 when the club selected defenseman **Mike Rathje** third overall and picked forward **Andrei Nazarov** 10th.

With two picks in the first round of last year's draft, the Sharks are set to make four picks in the first round over a two-year span for just the second time in team history. Most recently, San Jose picked second and 21st overall in 1996 - choosing defenseman **Andrei Zyuzin** and forward **Marco Sturm**, respectively - and second and 23rd overall in 1997 - acquiring forward **Patrick Marleau** and defenseman **Scott Hannan**, in order. If San Jose holds on to both first round selections it currently owns in 2025 - the Sharks' own as well as Vegas's first round pick acquired in the trade that sent Tomáš Hertl to the Golden Knights on March 8, 2024 - it would be the first time that San Jose has made six first-round picks in a three-year span.

From 2022 through the 2024 first round as it currently stands, San Jose will have made five picks - one shy of NHL-leading Chicago and Utah. With the acquisition of center **David Edstrom** (32nd overall in 2023) in the Hertl trade, the Sharks would match those two teams with six players within the organization who were selected in the first round since 2022 to lead the NHL. The rest of the Pacific Division shakes out with Anaheim and Calgary with four picks in that span, Seattle with three, Edmonton, Vancouver and Vegas with two and Los Angeles with one pick in that three-draft span.
