The San Jose Sharks enter the **2026 NHL Draft** with **seven selections**, including a pair of first-round picks - second overall and 27th overall, the latter pick courtesy of a trade June 17 that sent the 20th-overall selection to Buffalo in exchange for D Michael Kesselring and the Sabres' original first-round slot.

This will be the fourth consecutive draft in which the Sharks own multiple first-round selections, most recently selecting F **Michael Misa** (second overall) and G **Joshua Ravensbergen** (30th overall) in 2025. It is also the fourth-straight draft in which San Jose owns a top-four pick.

2025 SHARKS DRAFT RECAP

The Sharks made nine picks in the 2025 NHL Draft, including two in the first round with forward **Michael Misa** and netminder **Joshua Ravensbergen** as well as three more over the next two rounds, with defenseman **Haoxi (Simon) Wang** and forwards **Cole McKinney** and **Teddy Mutryn**. In a pair of historic selections, Ravensbergen was the highest-selected goaltender in Sharks history, the first ever by the club in either of the first two rounds. Wang, selected 33rd overall, was the earliest-selected native of China in league history, 76 picks earlier than the next-closest.

Misa spent nearly all of the 2025-26 season with the Sharks, finishing the season with 21 points over 45 games, 18 of the points coming over his final 38 games. He ranked sixth in scoring on the Sharks from Jan. 11 when he returned from World Juniors through the end of the season in scoring, fifth on the club with eight goals in that span. He posted two point streaks of four games, concluding the campaign with a point in each of the final four contests.

Ravensbergen earned WHL Goaltender of the Year honors after leading the circuit with 32 wins and .919 Save Percentage, finished the year tied for second with four shutouts and ranked fifth with a 2.51 Goals Against Average. He went on to tally a .918 SV% and 2.71 GAA in the postseason, going 6-6 over 12 contests to close out his stint in Prince George. He was named Sharks Prospect of the Week four times over the course of the season, earning each of the final two weekly organizational honors on March 23 and 30.

Wang, the first pick of the second day of the 2025 Draft, split his first full OHL campaign between the Oshawa Generals (28 games) and Niagara IceDogs (29 games), totaling 26 points (six goals, 20 assists) and 56 PIMs over the course of the season. Wang also represented China at the D1B World Championship, tying for second in scoring among defensemen at the tournament with four points in five games, co-leading the position group with a pair of goals en route to earning a Silver Medal and being named the tournament's best defenseman.

McKinney, selected with the draft pick that was acquired along with F Zack Ostapchuk from Ottawa in exchange for Fabian Zetterlund and a 2025 fourth-round pick at the 2025 NHL trade deadline, completed his first season of NCAA hockey at the University of Michigan. He totaled 20 points (eight goals, 12 assists) over 40 contests with the Wolverines, finishing the year tied for ninth on the club in goals and 10th on the team in points. He represented the United States at the World Junior Championship, tallying one assist while appearing in five games.

2025 SHARKS DRAFT RECAP CONTINUED

Mutryn finished fifth on the Moncton Wildcats of the QMJHL with 68 points in his first league season, ranking third on the club with 31 goals. He then elevated his game in the playoffs, helping Moncton reach the league final while finishing second in the league with 30 postseason points over 21 games.

Magomed Sultanov primarily spent the season with Loko Yaroslavl, logging 11 points (one goal, 10 assists) in 27 MHL games, and made his KHL debut with Lokomotiv Yaroslavl, skating in five contests.

Heise enjoyed a breakout season with Prince Albert in his first WHL campaign, clicking at a point-per-game pace with 63 points and a team-leading 29 goals in 63 contests.

Gallant played in his first collegiate season at Harvard, finishing in the top five on the Crimson in both goals (eight; T-3rd) and points (18; T-5th).

2026 DRAFT NOTES

A LUCKY LEAP

With a second lottery draw result of 11-4-3-7, the San Jose Sharks leapt from ninth to second as the Sharks overcame odds of just 5-percent to win the first draw as the ninth-best lottery odds team. It was the first time in Sharks history that the team climbed as the ping pong balls were chosen, the second of two 'upsets' on the day after Toronto won the first overall pick.

It was the first time that neither of the teams to finish in the bottom two of the standings selected in the top two since 2020. Recent lottery results can be found below:

The Sharks are just the second team to climb in draft order after improving year-over-year from the previous season since the inception of the two-draw lottery, San Jose's historic 34-point climb to 86 from 52 in 2024-25 joined by only Utah's 2024-25 improvement of 12 points to 89 from Arizona's 2023-24 season total of 77. The Mammoth went on to make the Stanley Cup Playoffs the following year (2025-26) with San Jose missing by just four points.

2026 DRAFT NOTES

THE FANTASTIC (TOP) FOUR

With the Sharks leaping to No. 2 in the draft, San Jose is poised to make a pick in the first four of the draft for the fourth consecutive season. Prior to 2023 with the selection of forward Will Smith at fourth overall, the Sharks had picked in the top four only five times in the team's history. San Jose can also make a top-two pick for the third time in three years after selecting in the top two only three times previously in team history, all in the first seven drafts after the team's inception.

Macklin Celebrini and Will Smith finished first and second on the Sharks in scoring last season, respectively, with the former posting a franchise-record 115 points and becoming the second NHL teen with a 40-goal, 70-assist season, joining only Wayne Gretzky, and the latter recording career highs across the board with 24 goals, 35 assists and 59 points as well as personal highs of eight power-play goals and 17 power-play points. Celebrini earned Ted Lindsay Award finalist recognition, one of the top-three vote-getters among NHLPA members for best player in the league. He was named Sharks Player of the Year by Bay Area media for the second consecutive season.

Michael Misa posted 21 points (nine goals, 12 assists) over 45 games in his first NHL season but was particularly strong over the second half of the season after missing extended time due to a lower-body injury suffered in November. From Jan. 11 through the end of the slate, Misa tied for ninth among league rookies with 18 points over 38 games, tied for seventh in the group with 14 even-strength points. He posted two point streaks of four games, finishing the season with two goals and two assists over the final four contests while finding the score sheet in all four contests.

With the lottery jump, San Jose is poised to become the fourth team in the lottery era to make a top-four pick in four consecutive seasons, joined by the Atlanta Thrashers (1999-2002), Pittsburgh Penguins (2003-06) and Chicago Blackhawks (2023-active).

The Penguins' 2003-06 picks helped guide the club to the 2009 Stanley Cup, with that season's Conn Smythe winner Evgeni Malkin, team captain Sidney Crosby, third-line center Jordan Staal and starting goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury.

The Sharks are in position to make a top-10 selection in four consecutive drafts for the first time in team history.

2026 DRAFT NOTES

DOUBLE-DIPPING IN THE FIRST ROUND

For the fourth consecutive year, San Jose enters the NHL Draft with a pair of selections to work with, including a top-two pick for the third consecutive season as well as the 27th-overall selection, acquired from Buffalo along with D Michael Kesselring in exchange for the 20th-overall pick, originally belonging to Edmonton and acquired by the Sharks at the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, on June 17. San Jose saw four of the six first-round picks made over the past two seasons already claim NHL roles, including forwards **Macklin Celebrini**, **Michael Misa** and **Will Smith** as well as defenseman **Sam Dickinson**.

Should the initial draft order hold through the opening round, the Sharks will have made nine first-round picks over the five drafts of the **Mike Grier** era, tied for second-most in the NHL in that span. The Sharks have also made the 33rd overall pick twice, previously selecting forward **Igor Chernyshov** (2024), who made a strong showing in his first NHL action in 2025-26, and prospect defenseman **Haoxi (Simon) Wang** in 2025.

Highlights from 2025-26 of Sharks first-rounders who have yet to appear in an NHL game include:

- **Filip Bystedt** was named San Jose Barracuda MVP after leading the team with 60 points (22 goals, 38 assists) in 65 games in his second full season in North America.
- **Quentin Musty** was selected as Barracuda co-Rookie of the Year after scoring 45 points (21 goals, 24 assists) in 61 games. He tied for fourth among AHL rookies in goals, tied for eighth in points.
- **Joshua Ravensbergen** was named WHL Goaltender of the Year after leading the league in wins (32) and SV% (.919), tying for second in shutouts (four) and ranking fifth in GAA (2.51).

2026 DRAFT NOTES
DEUCES WILD

For the second consecutive year, the Sharks enter the draft owning the second overall pick. Previously, the Sharks have made the second choice four times, selecting **Michael Misa** in 2025, **Patrick Marleau** in 1997, **Andrei Zyuzin** in 1996 and the team's first-ever draft pick, **Pat Falloon**, in 1991.

Marleau boasted one of the most prolific careers in Sharks history, the first player to have his number retired by the organization when the No. 12 banner was raised to the SAP Center rafters on Feb. 25, 2023. The NHL's all-time leader in games played, Marleau skated in 1,607 career contests as a Shark, most ever by a player with the franchise, and his 522 career goals and 1,111 points in teal also tops the Sharks' charts. Marleau's career spanned over the longest era of championship contention for the Sharks, helping the team reach the Stanley Cup Final in 2015-16 and reaching the Western Conference Final four times in his tenure in teal.

Misa finished his rookie season in San Jose with 21 points (nine goals, 12 assists) over 45 games, closing the campaign on a four-game point streak, one of two such runs on the season for him. Zyuzin appeared in parts of two seasons with the Sharks, totaling 17 points (nine goals, eight assists) over 81 games before being traded to Tampa Bay on Aug. 4, 1999. Falloon played in four full seasons with San Jose before being dealt to Philadelphia, with the forward amassing 162 points (76 goals, 86 assists) in 258 games as a Shark.

The second-overall pick can offer players who owned a role that helped their teams' long-term success, with 12 second-selections since 2000 capturing Stanley Cups (nine with the team that drafted them), 12 who earned league individual awards and 14 who appeared in at least one NHL All-Star Game. Each of the past three teams, and seven of the past eight who have added a second-overall pick to their roster in the season that follows the draft, have seen their record improve year-over-year dating back 10 drafts (Simon Nemec did not appear for New Jersey in 2022-23; Seattle did not play prior to selecting Matty Beniers in 2021).
